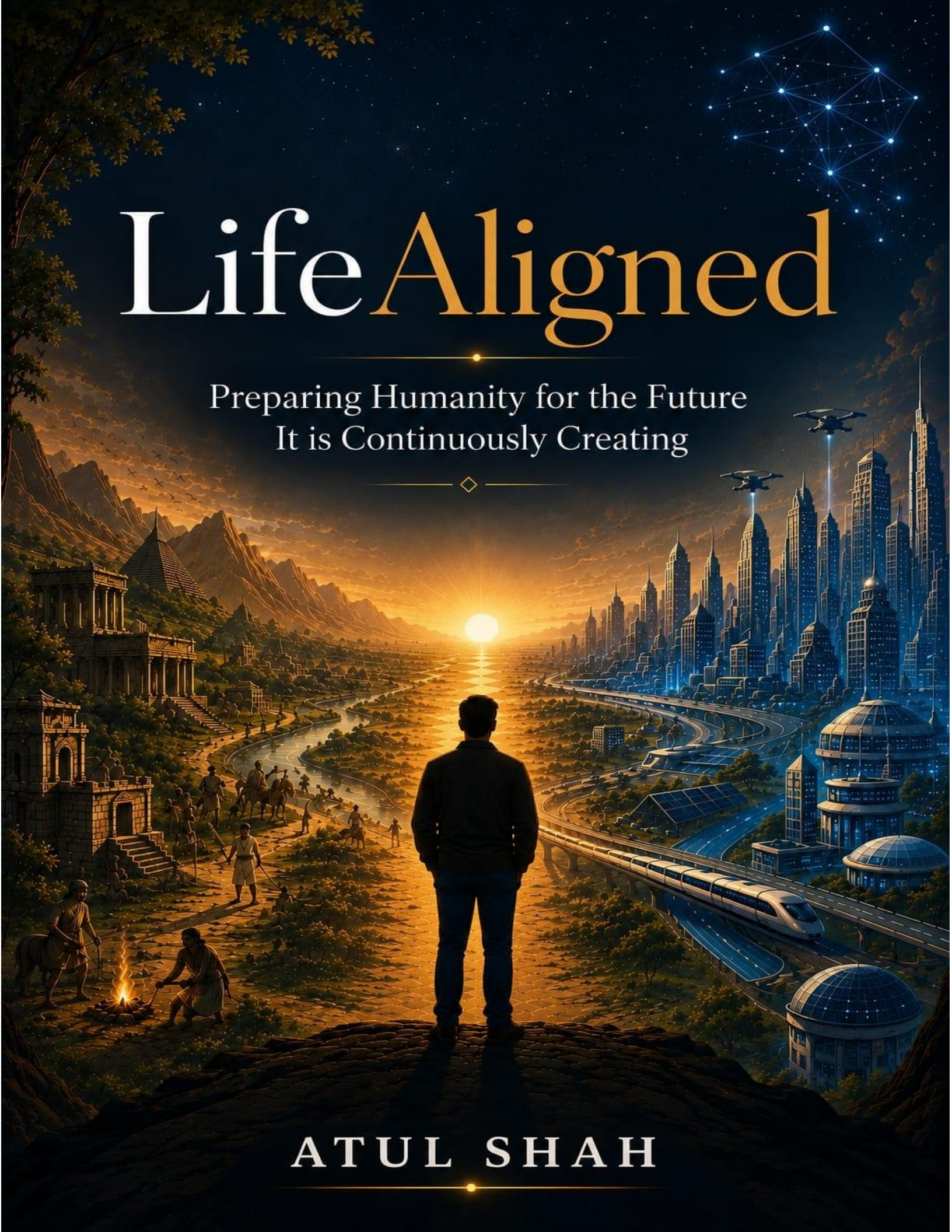

It is something... humanity... continuously creates... through its choices.

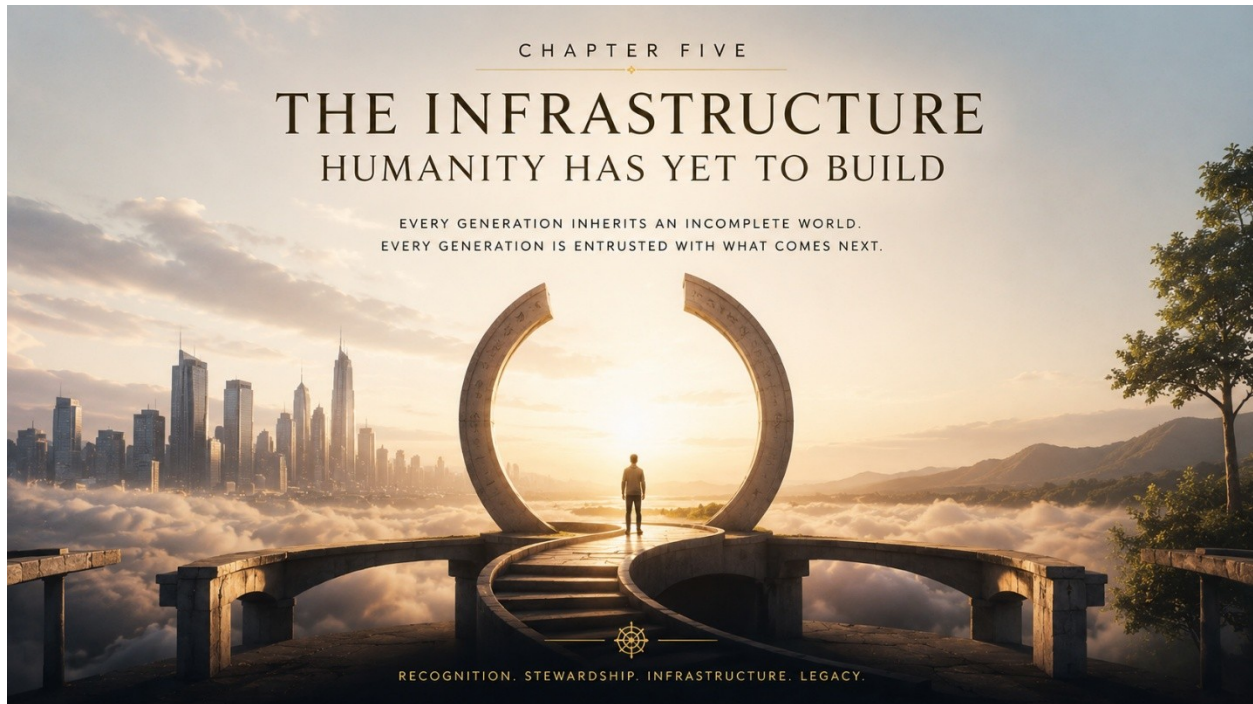
And perhaps... the greatest choice... before us... is whether... we will prepare... ourselves... as intentionally... as we prepare... the world... we are creating.

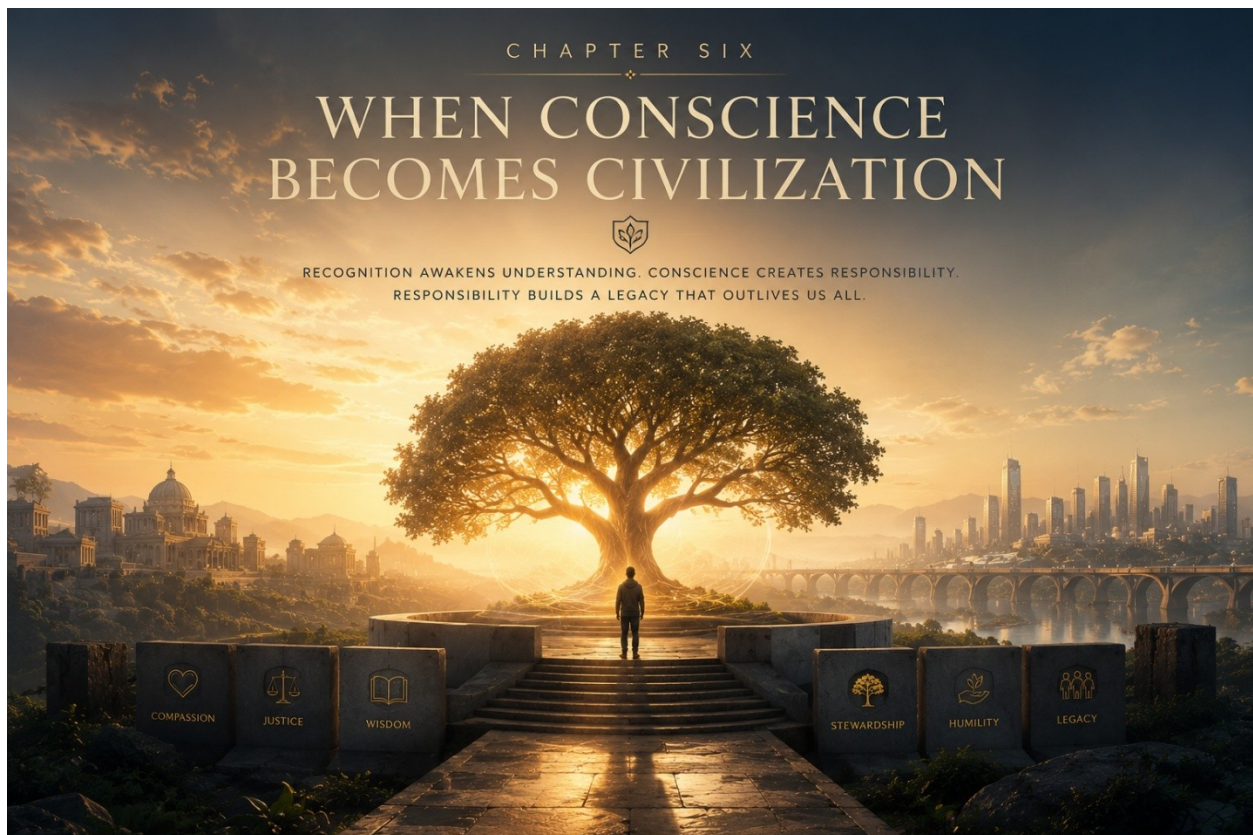
When Conscience Becomes Civilization

The question we now carry together... is not unique... to our generation. History has encountered it... many times before.

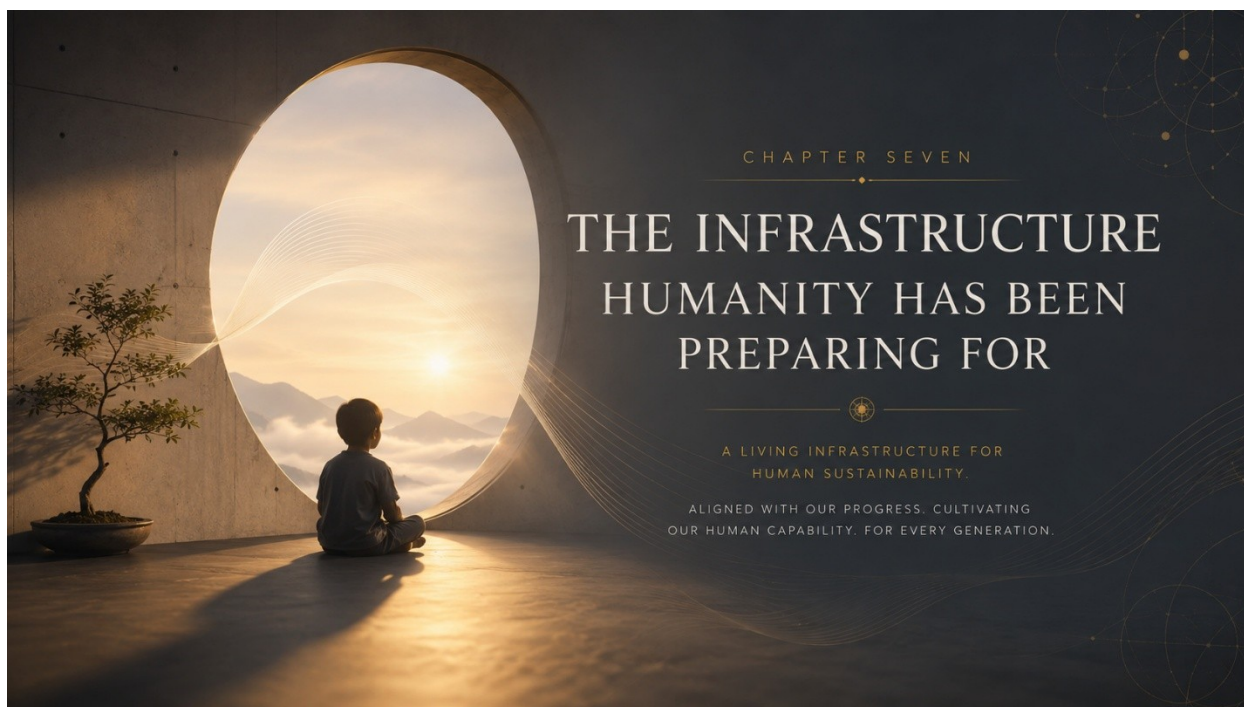
Each time... it arrived quietly. Not as a crisis. But as a realization.

Beyond a Generation

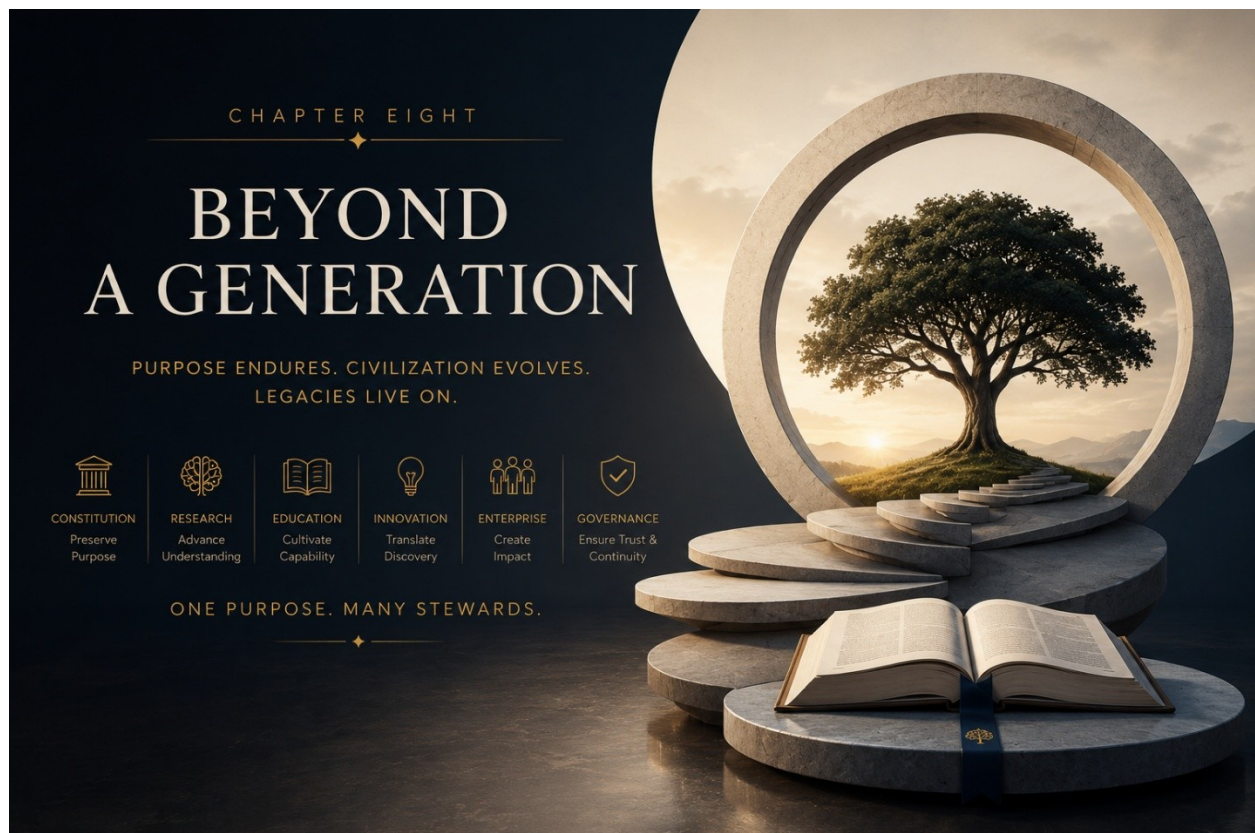
THE PROBLEM OF TIME
